HIGHEST MARK IN AFRICA & THE WORLD!

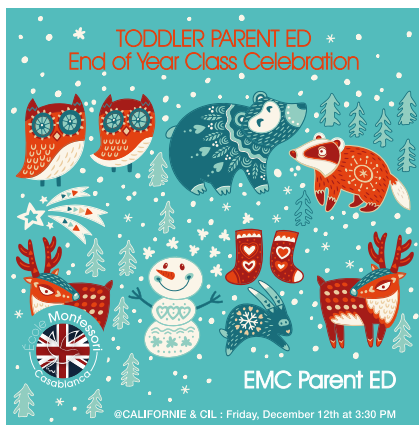

What a special moment!

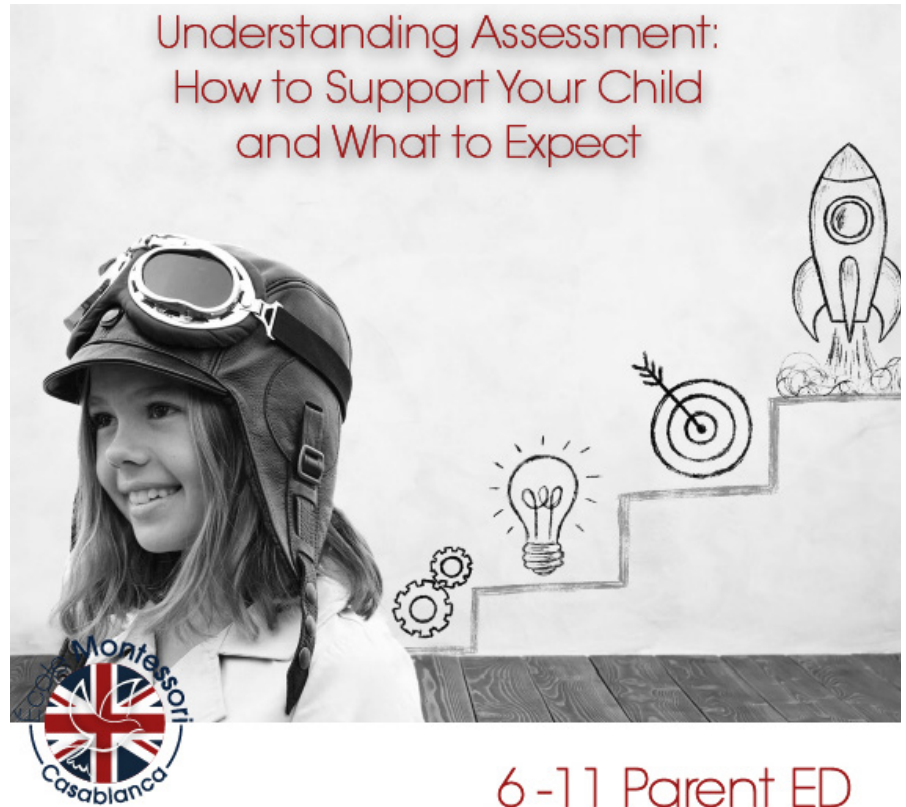




A LOOK AT INDEPENDENCE

This workshop's topic uncovered the notion of physical independence, particularly focusing on the practical considerations surrounding the process of changing clothes—an activity that adults often take for granted - and toileting awareness, that raises many questions.

For young children, it represents a journey toward self-sufficiency and self-esteem. The act of changing and understanding the elimination processes becomes a reflection of their growing autonomy, as they learn to navigate their own bodies and make choices. This allows them to develop confidence in their abilities. Throughout this discussion, we explored a series of effective strategies that can aid in fostering this independence.

ELEMENTARY ASSESSMENTS: HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AND WHAT TO EXPECT

Parents joined us for an informative session designed to help them gain a clearer understanding of how assessment supports learning rather than adds pressure. We explored the different types of assessments used in our classrooms, what they reveal about your child's progress, and how parents could offer the right kind of support at home.

We also looked closely at how teachers give feedback through the "What Went Well" and "What Can Be Improved" sections — empowering children to celebrate achievements and set realistic next steps. In addition, we shared practical strategies for parents to minimize stress around assessments, such as creating calm routines, focusing on effort rather than scores, and encouraging a growth mindset

What a joyful morning it was — filled with laughter, smiles, and visible magic. Watching the children's curiosity and independence blossom as they prepared their own little treats was pure delight.

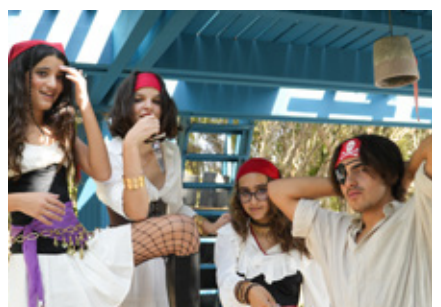

BRITISH SCHOOL OVERSEAS ACCREDITATION



British Schools Overseas (BSO) inspections are categorized into two primary types: Compliance and Educational Quality.

Schools typically choose between these two options depending on their accreditation needs:

- **Compliance-Only Inspection:** Focuses strictly on whether the school meets the minimum Standards for British Schools Overseas. These standards cover eight core areas, including the quality of education, welfare, health and safety, and leadership.

- **Combined Inspection (Educational Quality and Compliance):** This more comprehensive option includes the compliance check plus a detailed evaluation of educational quality. This second component focuses specifically on two key outcomes for pupils:

- The quality of pupils' learning and achievement.
- The quality of pupils' personal development.

BSO inspections are conducted by approved bodies such as the Independent Schools Inspectorate (ISI), Education Development Trust (EDT), and Penta International. Accreditation from these inspections lasts for three years.

What's Assessed (BSO Standards)?

Inspectors evaluate the school against specific BSO Standards, covering:

- Quality of Education & SMSC (Spiritual, Moral, Social, Cultural development).
- Pupil Welfare, Health & Safety.
- Suitability of Staff & Proprietors.
- Quality of Premises & Accommodation.
- Provision of Information & Complaints Handling.
- Quality of Boarding (where applicable).
- Leadership & Management.

EMC underwent a rigorous Combined Inspection (Educational Quality and Compliance) and we are happy to announce that we passed the challenge brilliantly. You can find the full report [here](#). It will be published on the ISI website shortly.

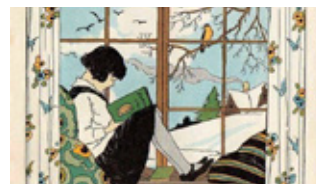

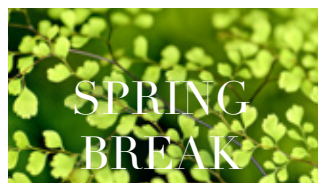

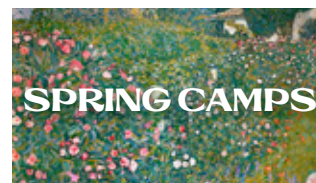
