ACADEMICS AT EMC



They had the chance to explore Roman artifacts from Volubilis, marvel at the intricate mosaics, and discover the historical significance of Lixus artifacts in relation to Moroccan history.

They also saw ancient jewelry from Roman and Islamic times, made from sea shells and metals. They explored Amazigh jewelry, like special bridal items, everyday jewelry, and clothes with cultural importance.

It was a day full of learning and fun!



HoY @ Barcelona!

Our most recent trip to Barcelona was a success and we would like to share with you some highlights that made it memorable for everyone. Enjoy!

For our HoY learners, this current cycle has been all about studying the concept of walls in varied areas of study and learning about how they influence the ways we relate with each other. Walls convey a variety of messages about the culture, history, and society of a place, and although they started as a simple utilitarian element to defend a place from threats, a wall now reflects the characteristics of a community. They tell us whether we are welcome, how to behave, and the character of the people behind them.

On Friday, our students embarked on an exciting 4-day journey of exploration as part of this theme and visited the magnificent city of Barcelona in Spain. Being one of the largest metropolises on the Mediterranean Sea, this urban center is a harmonious blending of history

and modernity, surrounded by Roman walls and Gothic buildings. From visits to museums and cathedrals, to discovering the old town and Gaudí's greatest architectural works, our children made the most out of this meaningful trip and crowned it as a very significant experience in their educational background.

Right after arriving in the city, our adolescents didn't waste time and headed to CosmoCaixa, Barcelona's Science Museum. CosmoCaixa is considered as one of Europe's most renowned museums thanks to its didactic and interactive approach to learning, giving our children the opportunity to explore physical, technical, geological, chemical and mathematical relations in hundreds of experiments.

On day 2, our House of Youth participated in an Outdoor Escape Game and competed in teams to discover the ancient Roman city walls and the Gothic quarters of Barcelona while following a background story of historical figures, finding clues and

solving puzzles. Adel's team won, overcoming that of our esteemed Spaniard and very own tour guide Nico!

And what is a trip to Spain without witnessing Barca? The students were fortunate enough to witness one of the biggest home games of the season between FC Barcelona and Atlético Madrid, in front row, pitch-side seats at the Barcelona Olympic Stadium, which was home to the 1992 Olympic Games. This venue is a masterpiece of modernist architecture and provides a stunning view of the city, becoming a true gem of the city.

Travelling the city's metro lines day and night, as well as covering thousands of steps on foot, our learners also visited famous parks and iconic feats designed by Antonio Gaudí, such as the Sagrada Familia church and Park Güell, wrapped in the artist's distinctive style of voluptuous color and texture, freedom of form, and organic unity.

WALLS THEME AT HOY

The theme of the first cycle at HoY was Walls. The concept was approached in varied areas of study with an overarching question: how walls influence the ways we relate to each other.

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LET'S START WITH OUR SCHOOL WALLS...

As part of our hyperlocal field work, our young geographers spent time outside of our school walls to conduct a bio-polar analysis of the barriers that separate our school from the outside world. Conducting such research of a familiar place where we spend most our time is a stepping stone to observing walls in a wider context.

The main focus for our young geographers involved observing, as well as scoring, characteristics of our school walls such as height, build quality, visual deterrence and longevity considering the climate. Our next piece of fieldwork will involve observing local and regional sites.



LET'S CLIMB THESE WALLS!

As sports play a vital role in shaping our children as well, Wall Climbing was incorporated to our curriculum under the guidance of our very own passionate climber guide: Mr Nico (or Mr Techo for his students). The students went to the Cafc-Evasion club every Wednesday morning to enjoy this new sport.


